

COMPLETE COLLEGE WYOMING REMEDIAL EDUCATION UNDERGOES A TRANSFORMATION

- 56% of all college students attending community colleges start in remediation.
- 51% of Wyoming's 2013 graduates attending a Wyoming college tested into at least one remedial course (22% English, 45% Math).
- Not every student who needs remediation is coming directly from high school.
- Every institution is working on initiatives to improve placement and success rates for these students.
- Initiatives include using additional indicators for placement, co-requisite models of enrolling students in the college-level and developmental courses at the same time, and accelerated models for moving through skill-building courses.
- Early data from Central Wyoming College shows a change from a 35% to 67% completion rate in corequisite English. Casper College's joint class in the high schools has resulted in changing with score gains on the ACT of 7 points.
